
**OUR MODEL** 

Central to the mission of JLM is the personal and professional growth of our members. We have been building the capacity of women leaders in Miami for nearly 100 years. Through trainings that build specific skills and volunteer leadership positions that contribute to holistic growth, our unique model places members in JLM leadership roles that mirror positions found at both for-profit and nonprofit organizations.

Governed by a Board of Directors and managed by a separate Executive Management Team, JLM is a 501(c)(3) organization and our volunteer leaders promote diversity, build teams, steward budgets, and deliver impactful results. Our current and past leaders are executives across a wide array of industries in Miami.

**OUR HISTORY** 

JLM has been training, developing, and empowering women throughout Miami-Dade County for 92 years. Throughout the League's history, the volunteering women of JLM have planted the seeds for many programs that are still part of this community today. Some have grown into major institutions, like the Children's Home Society, begun in the early 1930s, and the Phillip and Patricia Frost Museum of Science, started by the League in 1949.

# MESSAGE FROM THE **PRESIDENT**

The over 800 women of the Junior League of Miami are united by our common interest in building a stronger community and cultivating female civic leaders. Our mission is simple yet powerful: we promote voluntarism, develop the potential of women, and improve our community through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers.

Our members hail from a diverse array of backgrounds, and come together around a shared passion for making our community a better place for all. We pride ourselves on the training we offer our members, with a wide variety of opportunities to make an impact while developing critical leadership skills.

How do we make this impact? We prepare and empower our members to make a difference. In the last year alone, we hosted 85 community-based events, including assisting 63 families who are survivors of domestic violence get back on their feet, serving over 500 meals to homeless neighbors, building and delivering holiday meal baskets for families in need, and helping hundreds of local children improve their reading skills through the Therapy Dogs program.

Since our founding in 1926, the League has been dedicated to nurturing and training women to become community leaders and change agents. Our volunteers are everywhere in Miami-Dade – on nonprofit and for-profit boards, leading nonprofits, and running businesses.

### INN TRANSITION NORTH & INN TRANSITION SOUTH

Inn Transition is a creative and vital answer to transitional housing for women and children who are survivors of domestic violence, providing housing, counseling, and life skills for families in need.

#### **OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS**

A committee of volunteers works with families moving out of Inn Transition North and Inn Transition South to help facilitate a successful move into their new home.

#### THERAPY DOGS

JLM works with libraries throughout Miami-Dade to bring certified therapy dog teams to help children connect with books and develop a love of reading.

#### **ADVOCACY**

The State Public Affairs Committee (SPAC) is dedicated to monitoring and promoting important legislation and advocating for issues affecting at-risk families in our community. There are 22 Junior League public affairs committees in cities throughout Florida working together on our communities' most pressing issues.

#### **DONE IN A DAY**

Done in a Day provides volunteers and resources to local organizations for short-term, one-day events that fall within the Junior League's mission.

#### **POVERTY SIMULATION**

Poverty Simulation is an interactive immersion experience that sensitizes participants and reveals the realities and misconceptions of poverty.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

JLM is proud to sponsor college scholarships awarded to three female, high school seniors in the Miami-Dade County Public School System, who have exhibited superior community service involvement during their high school careers, while maintaining high academic achievement. Two of the three scholarships are awarded in memory of Junior League of Miami member, Kathryn Menke Miller, and the third scholarship is administered by JLM with funds

provided by the Uppaluri Family Foundation.


